I have a small book named "Comfortable with Uncertainty". When I saw the title I was intrigued and thought, "As if anyone is very comfortable with uncertainty, and, I would like to grow in this area". The subtitle is "108 Teachings on Cultivating Fearlessness and Compassion". The book is by Pema Chodron, an American Buddhist nun.

The teaching I share here is about 'Lightening Up" and I have found it helpful. I think that often we Christians can take ourselves and our faith too seriously. It is easy to become burdened by our own expectations of ourselves and of our faith journey. We may learn something valuable from Pema.

Being able to lighten up is the key to feeling at home with your body, mind, and emotions, to feeling worthy to live on this planet. For example, you can hear the slogan "Always maintain only a joyful mind" and start beating yourself over the head for never being joyful. That kind of witness is a bit heavy.

This earnestness, this seriousness about everything in our lives — including practice — this goal-oriented, we're-going-to-do-it-or-else attitude, is the world's greatest killjoy. There's no sense of appreciation because we're so solemn about everything. In contrast, a joyful mind is very ordinary and relaxed. So lighten up. Don't make such a big deal.

When your aspiration is to lighten up, you begin to have a sense of humor. Your serious state of mind keeps getting popped. In addition to a sense of humor, a basic support for a joyful mind is curiosity, paying attention, taking an interest in the world around you. Happiness is not required, but being curious without a heavy judgmental attitude helps. If you are judgmental, you can even be curious about that.

Curiosity encourages cheering up. So does simply remembering to do something different. We are so locked into this sense of burden – Big Deal Joy and Big Deal Unhappiness – that it's sometimes helpful just to change the pattern. Anything out of the ordinary will help. You can go to the window and look at the sky, you can splash cold water on your face, you can sing in the shower, you can go jogging – anything that's against your usual pattern. That's how things start to lighten up.

In the midst of the uncertainty in which we live now, in your face uncertainty, let's remember to 'lighten up' and not take ourselves or others too seriously. Find joy in the small things and little occurrences of your day. Smile, and thank God for being present with us each moment and for the opportunities

we have to practice becoming comfortable with uncertainty!

Children's Sunday School Update

Board of Christian Ed has met and we have decided on two exciting Sunday School programs for our children. Due to the uncertainty of COVID cases due to the Delta variant and the fact that many of our children are too young to be vaccinated, both programs will be offered virtual.

Sunday School for children Kindergarten through 7th grade:

This will again be offered every Sunday morning at 11:30 Via Zoom. Lessons will run approximately 30 to 45 minutes and consist of a Bible story/lesson followed by an activity relating to the lesson. The activity could be a word game, an arts and crafts project, a cooking activity, a game, a Bible activity or possibly a virtual escape room. There will be many opportunities for students to navigate the Bible. For students who are unable to attend the interactive class (or any interested adult) lessons will be recorded for viewing on the Shenkel Youtube channel. Each child will receive his or her own box of supplies for ALL lessons. Parents just need to help their child log on and we will do the rest. Parents do not need to attend with child but are welcome to sit in if desired.

Sunday School for children ages 1 through 4

Each Sunday I (with help from my husband) will read a Bible story which will be the same lesson our older children are learning. In addition to the story there will be a small activity and song we do with our preschoolers. This lesson will be recorded and available for viewing around 1:00 PM on the Shenkel Youtube channel. Parents and/or grandparents can put the lesson on whenever time works for the child and themselves. Preschoolers will also receive a box with any supplies they may need.



Impossibly Easy Salted Caramel Apple Mini Pies

Prep 15 minutes

Total 35 minutes

Servings 12

A yummy Bisquick® batter, apples and cinnamon bake up to make impossibly delicious little "apple pies" topped with whipped cream, caramel, pecans and sea salt. You won't miss the traditional pie crust!

Ingredients:

Apple Filling

1 1/2 cups peeled diced (1/4-inch) Granny Smith apples

3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Batter

1/2 cup Original Bisquick™ mix

1/3 cup sugar

1/3 cup milk

2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted

1 egg

Topping

3/4 cup sweetened whipped cream

1/2 cup caramel topping

1/4 cup chopped toasted pecans

Coarse sea salt, if desired

Steps

Heat oven to 375°F. Place paper baking cups in each of 12 regular-size muffin cups; spray with cooking spray. In small bowl, mix Apple Filling; set aside.

In another small bowl, stir together Batter ingredients with whisk or fork until blended. Spoon 1 level measuring tablespoon batter into each paper-lined muffin cup. Top with 2 measuring tablespoons apples. Spoon 1 level measuring tablespoon remaining batter over apples in each muffin cup.

Bake 15 minutes or until set in center and edges are golden brown. Cool 5 minutes; remove from muffin pan. To serve, leave in paper baking cup or remove; place in small individual serving bowls. Top each pie with 1 tablespoon whipped cream, 2 teaspoons caramel sauce and 1 teaspoon pecans; sprinkle with salt.
