Or chosen a different vocation. Or a different partner. For some of us, it's easier to focus on the woulda, coulda, shouldas and miss what is right in front of us. Each of us has touched people in a positive way, whether we are trying to live out our faith or just trying to be good people. We may even have changed someone's life by saying what they needed to hear, being there when they needed someone to listen. You may or may not have built the "impressive buildings," but in the end it really doesn't matter what you did, just how you did it. With compassion. Kindness. Understanding. In this season of beauty and love, when God sent Love to earth in human form to change the world, let us remember that no matter what our circumstances, it really IS a wonderful life!
